From cleaning products and nail polish remover, to lawn fertilizer and motor oil, hazardous materials are used in day-to-day life. Items with labels that say toxic, flammable or "keep out of reach of children", should be stored, handled and disposed of with care. Improper disposal can pose significant threats to health, safety and the environment.

PLEASE RECYCLE—paper products, glass, magazines, cardboard, metal cans and plastic. Please rinse out your plastic/glass/metal containers & sort. Remove metal lids & put in with tin cans. UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS- light bulbs, mirrors, windows, Styrofoam and waxy cardboard., i.e. orange juice containers.
