TO MEMBERS OF THE DEPOT PRESERVATION COMMITTEE:

This memo is to inform you of recent developments in the Depot Preservation project by the Town of Livermore and the local Bicentennial Committee.

The Town Council accepted the depot for preservation from the Elevator at a special Council meeting, Saturday, Sept. 27. They agreed to make funds available in order that application could be made to the State Bicentennial Committee for matching funds.

This application was completed by the local Bicentennial Committee the following Tuesday, as Wed., Oct. 1, was the deadline. The amount applied for was \$7,500. Of course, we have not and will not hear the result of this application as we are allowed to have a personal interview in Des Moines in November if we request one. So, it will likely be a couple of months before we know of the outcome.

In searching for a site for the depot, The Committee wrote to Marguerite Wyman and her family about their lots across from Smith Lumber. Upon receipt of the letter, they immediately phoned that they were considering it and would be here in a couple of weeks, health permitting, at which time they would like more definite information as to the plans for the depot as a museum.

Now!!!!!! We have our homework cut out for us. We MUST come up with some answers! Be thinking about this and if we get a rainy day, maybe the Depot Committee could meet for discussion.
